On January 14th, UCR along with UCSA lobbied the legislature to work with the Governor to include these immediate priority areas:</li> <li>1) Immigration Legal Services - We apprecia Governor for proposing \$1.3M in annual fur be used towards supporting the current amount of \$1. adequate for supporting the current amount of \$1. adequate for supporting the current amount of \$1. adequate for supporting the current amount of funding covers. - 2) Enrollment Growth - While the Governor Budget provides a modest amount of \$10M funds to support the enrollment of 1,000 add UC students, it is far from reaching the level funding need to supported the expected undergraduate enrollment growth at the UC. Furthermore, the budget does not account for graduate enrollment increase of 1,000 studer is expected to take place at the UC. In order support the graduate enrollment expansion a provide necessary funding for the expected of enrollment growth at the UC, the state needs invest an additional \$30.3M in ongoing fund geared towards continued expansion of enrol at the UC.
  - 3) Basic Needs Resources While the Governor's budget provided an ongoing \$15M allocation addressing student hunger and housing in the form of financial aid for students, it failed to include allocations for basic needs resources and programs that help alleviate housing and food insecurity: programs and resources that students directly interact with on our campuses. Many of our current programs rely on continued and ongoing state funding to operate in the future years to support tens of thousands of students across the UC who are basic needs insecure. In 2018, UC Basic Needs Representatives reported that the state will need to invest \$7.5M in ongoing funds to help sustain the expected growth in student usage of the existing programs and resources. We would like to see the Governor's revised budget reflect this amount in it.
- Racial Justice Now Event: Lobby Corps has teamed up with Racial Justice Now (RJN)- a campaign within UCSA focusing on Concre Policy Changes by UCSA, Board of Regents UCOP in areas of Education funding, Increa Racial diversity in the UC, Greater funding f Recruitment and Retention Centers, Police Oversight/Community Policing/ Local Polico Policy Changes And uplifting the personhoo and concerns of marginalized UC students.
