The final Monthly Report is a highlight of the projects ASUCR elected students, appointed students, and student committees have made throughout the 2018-2019 school year.

The following is a recap per quarter 2018-2019 school year:

In Fall Quarter:

- *Green Campus Action Plan* obtained 6 Big Belly Recycling Bins which compresses trash 5 times more than regular trash cans
- *Marketing Committee* worked on the Umbrella Project that was distributed throughout the school year & designed the R'Gear logo
- *Internal Affairs Committee* worked on snack wagon during finals week and testing material distribution
- *Finance Committee* allocated approximately \$11,876 to student organizations
- *Outreach Committee* visited two high schools and approved approximately 40k in grants
- *Transfer Committee* celebrate transfer students completion of their first quarter at UCR
- *Personnel Committee* worked on bylaw additions for the creation of new committees

- *Election Committee* set the Election timeline
- *Diversity Council* talked about more visibility and transparency of the committee, and addressed the lack of professors of color issue
- *Civic Engagement Committee* registered 287 people to vote
- *Highlander Action Plan* attended the AFSCME→ UC workers strike
- *Lobby Corp* brought Congresswoman Norma J. Torres to campus to discuss current political issues & lobbied in Sacramento for various student needs

In Winter Quarter:

- *Green Campus Action Plan* used Bike Share money to give new bikes away to students and worked on Solar Umbrella near Career Center event
- *Marketing Committee* created an R'fest poster and promotional video
- *Internal Affairs Committee* worked on the Basic Needs Referendum
- *Finance Committee* allocated approximately \$11,171 to student organizations
- *Outreach Committee* Paint the Night event as a destresser and funded over 10k in grants
- *Transfer Committee* collected testimonials and started to collaborate with Career Center to help those Transfer Students
- *Personnel Committee* updated campus wide committees and volunteer lists
- *Election Committee* constitutional update and timeline for elections
- *Diversity Council* met with Chancellor Wilcox regarding issues Costo Hall is facing
- *Civic Engagement Committee*
- *Highlander Action Plan* planned Racial Justice Day
- *Lobby Corp* took Toxic Tour in the Inland Empire, organized a financial workshop, and three sectors of higher education press conference

In Spring Quarter:

- *Green Campus Action Plan* helped Zero Waste Club and the No Waste Left Behind event
- *Marketing Committee* kept Hydro Flask Contest to increase followers and posted and created flyers for events
- *Internal Affairs Committee* co-hosted the Campus Safety Forum with the Campus Safety Alliance and endorse Senator Projects such as Senator Davenport's Mental Health Fair
- *Finance Committee* allocated approximately \$2,700 to student organizations
- *Outreach Committee* attended ASUCR Committee Showcase and more grant allocations
- *Transfer Committee* hosted Transfer Achievement Celebration and Transfer Talks
- *Personnel Committee* held ASUCR Committee Showcase
- *Election Committee* passed over 20% of the UCR undergraduate students voted which helped pass all the Referendums and hosted Elections Aftermath Meeting
- *Diversity Council* planned on future programs to help Costo Hall

- *Civic Engagement Committee* involved with Voter Engagement Workgroup on campus to address Peer Education challenges around voting before the 2020 Primary Election in March
- *Highlander Action Plan* held Racial Justice Day and supported AFSCME strike
- *Lobby Corp* lobbied in the California State Capitol for stopping the tuition hike
